Gym Renovation at Litchfield

Renovations to the "Spartan Gym" were completed this summer. The old spayed on cellulose insulation on the ceiling and beams has been scraped off or covered up. 

October testing

Juniors will be taking the ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) on Tuesday, October 5, 2021. ASVAB is the military placement test but also measures student knowledge and ability in several areas. This has a career exploration section that gives students an opportunity to learn more about themselves and the world of work, to identify and explore potential goals, and to develop a strategy to help get to those goals.

Sophomores will be taking the PreACT on October 27th. This test is very similar to the ACT test but shorter in length. It tests on all four ACT test subjects: English, math, reading, and science. The results predict future success on the ACT test, provide current achievement as well as projected ACT scores (1-36) on the ACT test they take as juniors. Students may begin sharing their information with colleges and scholarship agencies. The interest inventory provides students with a personalized view of colleges and career alignments. Sophomores may study for the PreACT as they would for the ACT. Sophomores, you have an OnTo-College account where you can prepare for the PreACT test. Please see Mrs. Poland for more information.

College Tours

The Juniors attended the EducationQuest sponsored College Fair on September 13th in Broken Bow and had the opportunity to meet with over 35 colleges, specialty colleges, and military representatives.

The Virtual College Fairs sponsored by Education Quest are October 12th from 9 am to 12 pm, November 10th from 5 pm. to 8 pm, and December 8th from 9 am to 12 pm. You can go to eqf.org/collegefair to register. We encourage all seniors and juniors to tour colleges of their interest. This provides additional information to parents and students as students begin to decide where they wish to attend college. Remember, 2-year and 4-year colleges are important to visit.

ACT Test Dates

Registered for October 23rd national ACT test? Remember to study with our OnToCollege ACT Test preparation. December 11th registration deadline is November 6th. Go to www.act.org to register. Some students may qualify for an ACT fee waiver. Please have your student contact Mrs. Poland to inquire. <u>Seniors</u>, remember to use the John Baylor OnToCollege website and ACT Academy to review for your ACT test. <u>Juniors</u>, keep up on your OnToCollege and review any material as we go. Utilize Khan Academy to help review material, too.

Scholarships

There is a scholarship opportunity for students taking dual-enrollment college courses. Students participating in dual-enrollment college courses or early admit programs are encouraged to apply for the Access College Early (ACE) Scholarship if they show

financial need. This state and federally-funded scholarship will pay tuition and mandatory fees at participating Nebraska colleges. Applications will be reviewed by Nebraska's Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education (CCPE).
